

Measures Committee Recommendations:

- The Measures committee recommends that Driver #9 be removed from the list (“Implement free early childhood programming for all 4 and 5 year old children by 2013.”)
- The Committee members discussed their thoughts on Driver #5 (“100% of K-6 students will have access to regional after school programming.”)
 - o Potentially this Driver has been accomplished by activities of District 206 Compass Program and growth and development of YMCA child care programs.
 - o The Measures Committee recommended that we keep this Driver for now and see what the impacts and changes of the program are.
- Stewards approved the removal of Driver #9 (12 total Drivers remaining)
